

Cooperation with Law Enforcement

- 1. After I escaped the life of prostitution, a special agent for the United States Postal Service came to me and said that David was under investigation for money laundering. She had pictures of me and my journal, the ledger David made up all use to keep track of our earnings. She also told me David was under investigation for sex trafficking and taking girls across state lines for the purpose of prostitution. I was very scared, but happy that he was being investigated and decided to do what I could to help put him in jail.
- 2. The agent asked me a lot of questions, but I did not know many of the answers. They asked me to testify. I was very afraid of David even then, and I was so afraid to testify. I wrote a long letter to the judge about all the things David put me through and I read it aloud in court. A true and correct copy of the letter is attached hereto. David was in court when I read the letter and it was a very terrifying experience for me. When they brought him into the courtroom he yelled to his family "don't believe this lying bitch." My letter helped to put him in prison for 25 years though, so I am happy that I faced my fears and testified.
- 3. I received a letter from the United States Attorney's Office signed by the State Attorney General thanking me for my help and letting me know that I "demonstrated incredible courage through my testimony against [David]," despite all I had already been through.
