Next Steps Following the SRP Screening Call

Following the screening call, below are the next steps:

- 1. Schedule and complete your fingerprints with our **Printscan.** There is an approximately 72-hour window to receive your results. You must download your fingerprint records within the 72-hour window and then email a copy to the SRP Advocate.
- 2. Once SRP has received your fingerprint results, you will be assigned to an Intake Team within **2 business days.** The SRP Advocate will send an email introducing you to the Intake Team.
- 3. You will receive a call or email from the Intake Team within **5-7 business days.**
- 4. Complete your Intake. The first call will take up to **1 hour.** The Intake Team may need to have a few calls with you. They need to understand your trafficking experience well enough to determine if you are eligible for relief in each state. This may include when and where you experienced trafficking, what type of trafficking you experienced, and how your trafficking experience led to the criminal records.
- 5. The Intake Team will use the information that you give them and your fingerprint results to create an analysis of your eligibility for relief for each record. **This will take at least 2 weeks, but may take longer if more calls or research are needed.**
- 6. Complete a call with the Intake Team and SRP to discuss the analysis report.
- 7. SRP will locate one or more partners to take your cases. You may need a team of lawyers if you have records in more than one state, one lawyer for each state. **This will take at least six months, but may take a year or more if there are no partners able to take your case.** SRP is working to add new partners every day, but there are currently not enough lawyers to take all of the cases we have.
- 8. SRP will check in at least twice per year to provide updates on representation placement. Please do not hesitate to contact SRP staff at any time with questions, concerns, or issues.

PLEASE NOTE: Many of our legal partners have their own process that may require you to contact them directly to complete a self-referral. Once a legal partner has been identified, the SRP Advocate will email you with details on how to connect. If you need assistance to submit a self-referral, please contact the SRP Advocate.
